Another Good Man Gone

Although Harvey Miller had not been a well man since the time of his dangerous sickness last January, the community was much surprised to hear last Saturday morning that this man so well known among us had a few hours before passed from earth. The immediate cause of his death was paralysis of the heart. The dying man's wife, Dr. Salisbury and R. M. Barnhart were at the bedside when he peacefully breathed his last.

Mr. Miller had hundreds of friends in Emmet county. He was an honest man. We do not believe tht he ever intentionally injured any man. He has for years taken an active part in politics and has held the office of county supervisor for the district for the past nine years, being elected for three consecutive terms and this in face of the fact that he has always been overwhelmingly republican. He had the confidence of the common people. They believed in him. And we think that even his political enemies would not impute to him the slightest

dishonesty or crookedness in official life. His aim was to work for the people's interest. It was only a short time ago one bright afternoon that the writer was riding with Mr. Miller behind one of his favorite colts that he talked in the most hopeful spirits of his health and spoke with much enthusiasm of his political plans for the coming campaign. But now he has joined the great multitude where there is no politics and where his ever active mind may rest.

Harvey Miller was born June 17, 1832, Mercer county, Ohio. From there he came to Decorah, Iowa in 1858 where a few years later he enlisted in the 6th Iowa Cavalry. At the close of the war he located in Emmet county where he lived up to the time of his death. The funeral services were held at the M.E. church on Sunday, Rev. Cochran preaching the sermon, and were under the auspices of the Masonic order of which deceased was a member. The funeral was so largely attended that little more than half of those who came could get admission to the church. Many came from distant parts of the county. A wife and two married daughters survive Mr. Miller. (Northern Vindicator, Estherville, IA, May 31, 1894)

Harvey Miller Passes Away

At four o'clock Saturday morning Harvey Miller passed from this life. His last sickness was brief and it was not thought the end was near, but his former illness had sapped his strength and left him too weak to withstand another siege. He fought a good fight as he always did, whether on the field for his country, in civil life when questions of party were at issue, or for the rights of a friend. He succumbed only to the Grim Conqueror who has never known defeat.

The deceased was born in Ohio 61 years ago and when yet a young man moved to northwestern Iowa. He served through the war in the 6th Iowa cavalry and after the war was engaged for many years selling monuments through this region. Later he moved here, settling on a farm about twenty years ago. He was serving his ninth years as a member of the board of supervisors and was always a faithful and obliging official, doing his duty as he saw it. He leaves a widow and two married daughters to mourn him.

The funeral services were conducted by the Masonic fraternity, assisted by the G.A.R. post, the sermon being preached by Rev. Cochran of the M.E. church. The remains were interred in the west side cemetery and were followed to their last resting place by a large concourse of friends. (Emmet County Republican, Estherville, IA, May 31, 1894)

Soon after the death of Harvey Miller notice was received of the increase of his pension from \$12 to \$16 per month, and back pay to the amount of \$300. Mrs. Miller will receive the \$300 but not the \$4 increase. (Emmet County Republican, Estherville, IA, June 7, 1894)

Mrs. Harvey Miller, one of the oldest and most highly respected ladies of Estherville, passed away Thursday afternoon at her home on north Seventh street where she had resided the past twenty-eight years. Mrs. Miller was one of the most widely known women in Emmet county. The Miller family located here in 1877. Mr. Miller was a prominent G.A.R. man and held many offices of trust in this county. He was a member of the board of supervisors for several years and Mrs. Miller was very prominent in the

upbuilding of Estherville. She was a woman loved by all who knew her, a happy and pleasing disposition and generous in every sense of the word. She is going to be greatly missed by those with whom she mingled. Her pastor hands us the following obituary:

Mary M. Jack was born in Pennsylvania on July 1, 1841 and came to her death at her home in Estherville, Iowa, November 23, 1922 at the ripe old age of 81 years, four months and twenty-two days.

She came with her parents to Clayton county, Iowa, in 1856 where she met and was united in marriage to Harvey Miller during the year 1876. Together with her husband she came to Emmet county in 1877 where Mr. Miller died about twenty-eight years ago since which time Mrs. Miller has lived alone in her home on north Seventh street in this city, until Thursday afternoon, November 23rd, when she answered the summons and her spirit returned to the God who gave it.

For several years Mrs. Miller has been afflicted but made a brave fight and her great power of resistance made it possible for her to keep off the grim monster until she had passed the time allotted to man by more than eleven years. Many years ago she was soundly converted and immediately united with the Methodist Episcopal church. Being a woman of strong convictions she was very pronounced in her ideals and was always true to them. As a result of her strong religious convictions she has many who rise up to call her blessed, because of her spiritual helpfulness.

Mrs. Miller leaves to mourn her loss, one sister, Mrs. W. H. Nolings of Cedar Falls, and one niece, Mrs.

Herbert Renshaw of Inwood. Besides those two relatives she leaves many very dear friends and neighbors who were ever ready to give comfort and sympathy during her long and trying illness.

Funeral services were conducted from the home on north Seventh street, Saturday afternoon, the Rev. George H. Whiteaker of the Free Methodist church in charge. The Rev. J. W. LaGrone of the Methodist Episcopal church offered the prayer and Mrs. Albert Mahlum sang "The City Foursquare." Interment in Oak Hill cemetery. (Estherville Democrat, Estherville, IA, November 29, 1922)

Burial Rites Here For Mrs. D.M. Andrews

An Early Resident

Burial rites were held at Oak Hill cemetery Monday afternoon for Mrs. D.M. Andrews, 76, an early resident of Estherville and Emmet county. Mrs. Andrews died at the home of her widowed daughter, Mrs. Maude Hamilton, St. Louis, Mo., on Sunday, Sept. 24. She had been ill several months.

Della May Andrews was born Sept. 21, 1868 in Winneshiek county, Iowa, daughter of Margaret Arminta Fannon and Harvey Miller. She came to Estherville at the age of four with her parents and spent her early girlhood in this county. She was married in August, 1888 to Chas. W. Andrews. They moved to Nebraska where two children were born, Maude E. and Mac M. Andrews. Mrs. Andrews was widowed while quite young and spent the greater part of her life in Nebraska where she was well known as one of the first women pharmacists in the state. She was engaged in the drug business in Platte county.

Surviving are the daughter, Mrs. Hamilton of St. Louis, the son Mac M. Andrews of Lindsay, Neb. and two grandchildren, Mrs. R.R. Nantkes, Omaha and Tom Andrews of Lindsay also two nieces, Mrs. Cliff Cowman, Malland, Iowa, and Mrs. Milton Buffum, Emmetsburg. (Vindicator and Republican, Estherville, IA, September 28, 1944)
